TAG'S SCRUMPTIOUS CAFETERIA

Did you know that TAG'S cafeteria serves up to 800 meals a day? Thanks to food manager Chantal Hewlett, senior cook Marta Rivera, and assistant cook Symone Manning (pictured to the right) the cafeteria kitchen makes over 650 meals a day for all four schools in our building, and an additional 150 meals for an outside school.

The cafeteria staff prepares meals from the Department of Education high school lunch menu for all of the schools in the building, as well as Esperanza high school. The kitchen staff says this is a plus because there is a bigger variety of food and more options to choose from.

Each day a student gets to choose from a hot or cold meal, five different choices of sandwiches, fruit and a salad bar. Some examples of the main entrees that change daily are cheese stuffed shells, chicken tender rice bowl, pizza, BBQ chicken, meatball parmesan, Jamaican beef patty and Philly cheese steak sandwich. The drink choices are water, milk, and chocolate milk. The cafeteria cooks make sure that each student has at least one vegetable and a fruit on their plate. Symone Manning says, "It is important that the students get a balanced meal because we are responsible for not only feeding their bodies but their minds as well."

What's the most popular food item? Well it's not hard to guess pizza with BBQ chicken coming in a close second. French Fries are another big hit with the students. The kitchen staff is quick to say that TAG students overall are very good eaters and are always asking for more healthy choices.

Just this year the New York Department of Education partnered with the Department of Sanitation and implemented a composting program where every school has a brown bin where students can put their leftover food. The cooks make sure all of the students separate their trash and deposit their food into the composting bins. Once the Department of Sanitation picks up the composting they then turn it into Diesel fuel for their vehicles.

Another environmental challenge the Department of Education would like to address is the use of Styrofoam trays that are used to carry the food. These trays are not reusable so the idea is to find an alternative tray that is recyclable and is better for the environment. The cafeteria staff says this change can possibly be sped up if the PTA contacts the Department of Education or the district to encourage this change.

The staff is open to suggestions whether it is making the trays more environmentally friendly or different food options. The kitchen staff believes they are there to serve the students and



whatever makes them have a better eating experience they are all for it.

MT SINAI & NURSE MELTZER KEEP TAG HEALTHY!

The Mount Sinai School Based Health Center (SBHC) at the Tito Puente Education complex is a full service health clinic whose services are available to every student with in the school community once they are registered. It's full time staff are Pediatric Nurse Practitioner, Elyse Meltzer (pictured to the left); Medical Assistant, Juanita Gonzalez; and social worker, Karen Ciego. The SBHC is partially supported by state aid. There is no charge for the services, or co-pays, and the clinic can be utilized in addition to, or as your primary care. All children will be seen regardless of whether or not they have health insurance or who their carrier is.

Ms. Meltzer has been at the SBHC for 13 years. She and Juanita meet nearly every TAG student throughout the school year. Students come to the clinic for everything including playground injuries, acute sick visits, physicals, vaccines (flu as well as others), and chronic conditions (diabetes, asthma). Parents can bring their children directly to the clinic or call and ask for their child to be seen if they aren't feeling well or have a concern. As a nurse practitioner, Ms Meltzer can write prescriptions as warranted. The clinic staff works closely with school faculty as needed such as helping a student who is having adjustment difficulties or collaborating with the

gym teacher to identify asthmatic students before the annual PACER test.

Ms. Meltzer strives to have open communication with the entire TAG community. One of her goals is to have 95% of the TAG population register with the SBHC by submitting the parental consent packet. If your child has had a recent physical at an outside provider they would greatly appreciate a copy annually, so they can be in compliance with the SBH mission to ensure that all children are receiving health care. The Mount Sinai SBHC is located on the first floor in Room 107. It is open on school days from 8:30A to 3P.
