POOR RICHARDS PLAYGROUND FACELIFT

Children at TAG and others at the Tito Puento Education Complex are playing this fall on a beautifully repainted playground at 3rd Avenue and 109th thanks to the efforts of dozens of volunteers led by TAG parent, Nate Hamlin, the city's Partnership for Parks Foundation, and the accounting firm of Marks Paneth LLP, the project's corporate sponsor. Over two days in July, 40 volunteers scraped, primed, and painted playground equipment, including climbing gear, a slide, and swing sets. They also cleared weeds from and planted the area's garden beds. Thank you to Mr. Hamlin, The Partnership for Parks Foundation and Marks Paneth LLP for the beautification of the playground! The next step is to use the \$150,000 grant from Manhattan Borough **President. Gale Brewer.** Although Poor Richard's Park is on a list of long-term capital projects known as the City Parks Initiatives (CPI), a Mayor de Blasio program which targets for renovation parks in poor neighborhoods, it was not included on the most recently announced list by Parks Commissioner Mitchell Silver. There is more work to be done to encourage our community to make the school yard useful and accessible to the public and the school children on East 109th Street. Park neighbors are encouraging people to "like" the Facebook page of Friends of Poor Richard's Playground (https://www.facebook.com/ poorrichardsplayground) to build support and publicize the progress of park renovations.
